The Relevance of Social Work Practice for Social Development in Kenya

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Abstract

This article discusses how social work practise in different settings encourages social development. The extent to which professional social work practice contributes to social developments on which social development gaps social workers address in executing their mand ascertain this, a sample of 40 social workers was drawn to appraise the role of social work in economic development. Findings indicate that while executing their mandate, social work involved in the following social development activities: poverty alleviation (12.5%), H prevention and treatment (15.0%), social entrepreneurship (5.0%), child and maternal (12.5%), rehabilitation of street children (17.5%), social research and consultation environmental conservation (7.5%), and food security (22.5%).

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
