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Abstract

Social work is a growing professional discipline in Africa. Field education, or fieldwork, is a component of social work education that enables students to apply their classroom lear practice in the field. It has been argued that social work educators in many African countrie on classroom theoretical instruction with limited attention to field education. The Transform Field Education Landscape (TFEL) project is a partnership project that is conducting a si understand the current state of social work field education in the African continer partnership brings together partners including post-secondary institutions in Ethiopia, Eswatini, as well as international social work professional organizations. In the study, Afric education coordinators, directors, and heads of departments from undergraduate and gi social work programs were invited to complete one survey per post-secondary institution. T of the study was to understand social work field education placement models, policies, lo and gaps. It will be, to the best of our knowledge, the first pan-African study of social wo education in the past decade. The presentation aims to share the preliminary results of the research at the International Social Work Education and Practice Conference in Kenya un 'Field Education in Social Work Education track'. Implications and recommendations for soci field education will be discussed.
